How do I get on TownSq?

- On your computer or phone internet browser go to <https://app.townsq.io/ais/sign-up>
 - Enter your account number, zip code and name. (You should have received your account number in an email from me or if we don't have your email you should have or will be receiving a letter in the mail). If you don't see an email or the letter just email me at President@surreywoodliving.com and I'll email it to you.
 - Once you have registered you can either access the site by visiting the website at www.townsq.io or by downloading the Smartphone App on the AppStore (Apple) or GooglePlay (Android), just search: Townsq. Once you are there you can simply login with the email and password you used to register.
- Each member of your household can and should have their own TownSq Account
- If we have multiple owners listed for your home, we encourage each of you to register.

What can you do in Town Sq?

- Check to see if you have paid your SCA dues and pay them

On the Smartphone App:

- Click "Menu" in the bottom right corner
- Scroll down and click "Accounts"

On the website:

As scheduled, a meeting was held on 8/27 with VDOT representatives, Clover Hill District supervisor Chris Winslow, and others to discuss pothole repair and possible paving for Surreywood subdivision. Results of the meeting and subdivision tour were as follows: pothole and break away repair will be completed on Dell, Gateshead, and Surreywood Dr. within the next 60-90 days. Surreywood will be added to the list of potential Slurry candidates for 2021 (will discuss at annual meeting). The remaining length of Pocoshock will get new pavement in 2020.

Three work order requests for tree removal and easement overhang trimming were submitted to VDOT.

Street light bulb replacement/repair requests were submitted to Dominion Power for the poles at Capelwood and Lake Surrey and Lancashire at Lakeforest Dr.

The Surreywood sign frame at Dulles is up but has to be moved off VDOT easement.

Vice President's Report

Update: Pocoshock Villas and Dominion Power Lines

As fall is upon us, there are two prospective changes that align to the changing weather that is upon us. The first is in regards to Pocoshock Villas (the unfinished development near Hull and Pocoshock). On 9/10/19 there was a community meeting to discuss a proposed zoning change on the development. The project has been abandoned since 2007 and the developer is looking to approve the following in order to finish building 44 town homes according to the original plan. The primary changes to the original, approved plan include:

- Remove the 19+ resident age restriction. This was originally there to limit new elementary students, but the school district estimates an additional 9 students overall at most at all grade levels
- Updated architecture and design to match current standards
- Removal of cash proffers (aligned to current county policy)
- Increase of height from 1 to 1.5 stories for optional expansion in the future

Overall there were no concerning elements of the proposal, and will help revitalize an unsightly area.

This is pending approval at the 10/15 County meeting, but we did not have any issues to address that would concern Surreywood.

The second key change is the Dominion project to bury overhead cables in the neighborhood. Originally we had made a ton of progress, largely thanks to John Pride (thanks John!), to have the cables buried as an “internal enhancement”. Thanks to those efforts and repeated recent outages, Dominion has move the project to their “Strategic Underground Program” to fast track the effort. What this means is that we now have a dedicated team and higher priority in their project queue once the appropriate easements are signed.

So what does this mean for you? If you are in the footprint of the project, we strongly encourage you to sign or renew your easement agreement for the greater benefit of the neighborhood. I want to reiterate my thanks for John and all his volunteers that helped get this effort to where it is. If all goes well, we could potentially see this project start within 12 months.

As with any change, we encourage your engagement and feedback. To me these are two great examples of progress and I love seeing this area move forward on things that are important and beneficial to our Surreywood residents!



Overview:

This is a vital role in Surreywood and a key factor that differentiates us from our neighboring communities. We are very realistic that no will ever replace Willie as he has set the bar so high and taken on the lion share of the work personally. Going forward we expect this role to go back to how it was originally envisioned, where the Building and Grounds director keeps a running list of projects and duties that need to be done and utilizes more community workdays or individual volunteers to complete the work required. Willie is also working on a detailed listing of all his ongoing maintenance items and planned repairs and improvements over the next 3-5 years so there will be a very good road map to follow.

Specific Responsibilities:

Be responsible for maintenance of Community Property including the entrance walls, signs, kiosks, bulletin boards,

the Dell Drive median strip and its entryway sign, flag, flag pole, and spotlights, the Lake dam, the Lake access road, the Lake access path, the street signs and any other property owned by or controlled by the Association.

Monitor the landscaping contractor's grass cutting on Community Property and maintenance of the Dell Drive median strip.

Coordinate road repair issues with the Virginia Department of Transportation and maintenance of the street lights through communication with the County and Virginia Dominion Power.

Coordinate Community workdays for specific neighborhood spring and fall maintenance projects on an as-needed basis; publicize such events in the Association e-mail notification system and the Surreywood Scene.

Assist in any other project pertaining to the beautification of the Community.
